The Park is patrolled and monitored by National Park Rangers and Police. If you witness behaviour damaging to the area, please don't get involved and call the Police.



# RESPECT YOUR PARK



## FIRES

Do not light fires in woodlands and never cut down or damage trees. Fresh green wood doesn't burn and causes long-term damage to the environment. Use a stove if possible. If you have an open fire, bring your own wood, keep the fire small and under control. Make sure it's out and remove all traces before leaving.



## TOILETS

If 'nature calls' and there are no public toilets nearby, make sure you 'go' well away (30m) from open water, rivers and burns to avoid harming water supplies and fish. Be sure to bury your waste and take paper and wipes home with you.



## FISHING

Make sure you have a permit. Fishing line can kill or harm wildlife by damaging limbs or choking. Please dispose of fishing line responsibly – cut it into short lengths and take it home.



## LITTER

Litter always ruins a good view and can harm wildlife.

It's easy to do the right thing – **bag it up and take your litter home.** Consider picking up other litter as well. It is an offence to drop litter in the National Park. If you are found liable you may be fined a minimum of:

**€80\* FOR LITTERING**

**€200\* FOR FLY-TIPPING**

*\*The final amount may be higher if the case goes to court. A fine of up to £2,500 for littering and £40,000 for fly-tipping may be applied.*



## SAFE DRIVING

When driving in the National Park please be aware of the road conditions, stick to the speed limits and park your vehicle responsibly. Never drive under the influence of drink or drugs.



## CAMPING

Camping can be a great way to enjoy the Park and there are a wide range of places to camp in stunning surroundings throughout the area.

Prime locations that offer informal camping experiences include:

- The Cabin, Loch Lubnaig
- Sallochay Bay on East Loch Lomond

For those who prefer the solitude of 'wild camping' away from the hustle and bustle, there are plenty of great places to experience a magical night under the stars.

Whichever way you choose to camp, please ensure you do it responsibly and respectfully. Leave nothing but footprints and take nothing but memories.



## NOISE

We all want to enjoy the peaceful surroundings of the National Park. Please be considerate of others and keep noise and lights low especially after 9pm – remember people and wildlife live nearby.
