REQUEST UNDER ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2004

I refer to your request for information, received by email on 03rd August 2018. The information you have requested is environmental information, as defined in Regulation 2 of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (EIRs). The Park Authority has an obligation to deal with your request under the EIRs and an option to also deal with your request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA), unless the public interest lies in dealing with your request solely under the EIRs. We consider that the public interest in dealing with your request solely under the EIRs outweighs the public interest in also dealing with your request under FOISA, on the basis that the public interest is not served by duplicating consideration of your request under both regimes. We have therefore applied the exemption in section 39(2) of FOISA and dealt with your request under the EIRs alone.

As advised in our initial response letter of 3rd September, it was necessary to extend the deadline for completing the second part of your request. Your specific request and the response from the National Park Authority are provided below:

*"I would request all information, including correspondence, which the LLTNPA holds about the health and safety of the public and the dredging of Drumkinnon BEFORE the tragic incident where Rabin Rehan was drowned (I obviously have the information contained in the Construction Method Statement). What I am interested in knowing is **what dialogue, if any, took place on signage etc before the accident took place.**"*

All correspondence held by the Park Authority in relation to water signage at Drumkinnon Bay prior to 4th July 2018 is attached.

Some information has been redacted, namely the names and contact details of external third parties, the names and contact details of Park Authority staff below manager grade and some information from the content of emails that is unrelated to the request. This information has been withheld from release in accordance with Regulation 11(2) of the EIRs and the second and third Data Protection Principles.

The release of this information redacted would contravene the second and third Data Protection Principles as it was processed for one specific purpose and has been processed in accordance

This means that there is no requirement to consider the public interest in the disclosure of this information.

We have received a complaint about the raised areas that have been left behind following the dredging work in Drumkinnon Bay. It appears the contractor has not fully removed the temporary slipway that was put in place to allow the dredged material. You'll be aware this is directly in front of the beach area where the children's sand pit and picnic tables are (adjacent to the trailer car park).

Our planning team have raised this with the contractor and have asked for these raised areas to be rectified. In the meantime however, we have had reports of people choosing to walk along these raised areas into the bay. This is potentially hazardous as there is now an area of much deeper water there. These raised areas will be steep sided and it is possible someone could slip into the water not realising they are effectively walking on a steep sided ridge.

You currently have signage in place nearby which states "DANGER do not paddle or swim in this area. Deep water, uneven ground". However it seems this signage is either being ignored or is not being seen by the public.

Until the contractors remove this new hazard, we would suggest some additional signage is put in place around this area to warn people not to attempt to walk on these raised areas in the water. Our Access & recreation Manager Kenny Auld (cc'd) can help with any advice or wording for this sign.

Sign warns of water dangers to children

BALLOCH and Haldane Community Council announced that as a result of their concerns about a slipway at Loch Lomond Shores becoming a "danger for children" they have managed to have a sign erected.

Jim Biddulph, secretary of the community council, said at a meeting last Wednesday: "About the bay area at Loch Lomond Shores there are two sand banks and a deep hole off the picnic area.

"This was always the same depth area before dredging took place recently."

The dredging was being carried out as required work before the European Open Swimming Championships in August.

Mr Biddulph added: "This could now be a danger to young children who might not realise the danger of slipping off the sandbanks and wandering into sudden deep water.

"We addressed this matter and a sign has been put up warning parents and the public of the danger of this area."

The community council were also told of the "mess" being left by the general public in the picnic area and needs to be addressed by the company who have been working there. The local members called for the area to be restored to its original state.

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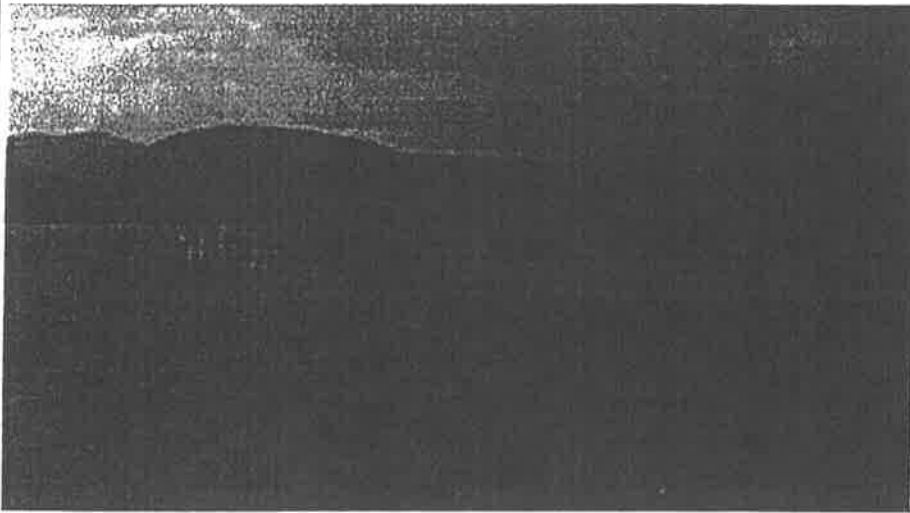

Hi Anna,

Yes there are a fair few inaccuracies in that post. Work wasn't halted by SEPA for any reason, an environmental impact assessment was carried out including checking for spawning grounds (nothing was impacted), and it is completely unrelated to the unauthorised felling. Once the temporary slipway was removed, the water level dropped and exposed these strips of land which weren't previously there.

[REDACTED] has been liaising with Glasgow 2018 as this new feature is not part of their consent. It is likely they will need further permissions from SEPA to go back in and rectify it. I've raised this separately with the project manager and warned them that it is likely that if it's not rectified ASAP there will be negative press and comment about it. I have put three warning signs in place.

[REDACTED] may have a further update as to where we're at with the contractor coming back to fix this.

Perhaps we could pop down later to see how deep it really is?

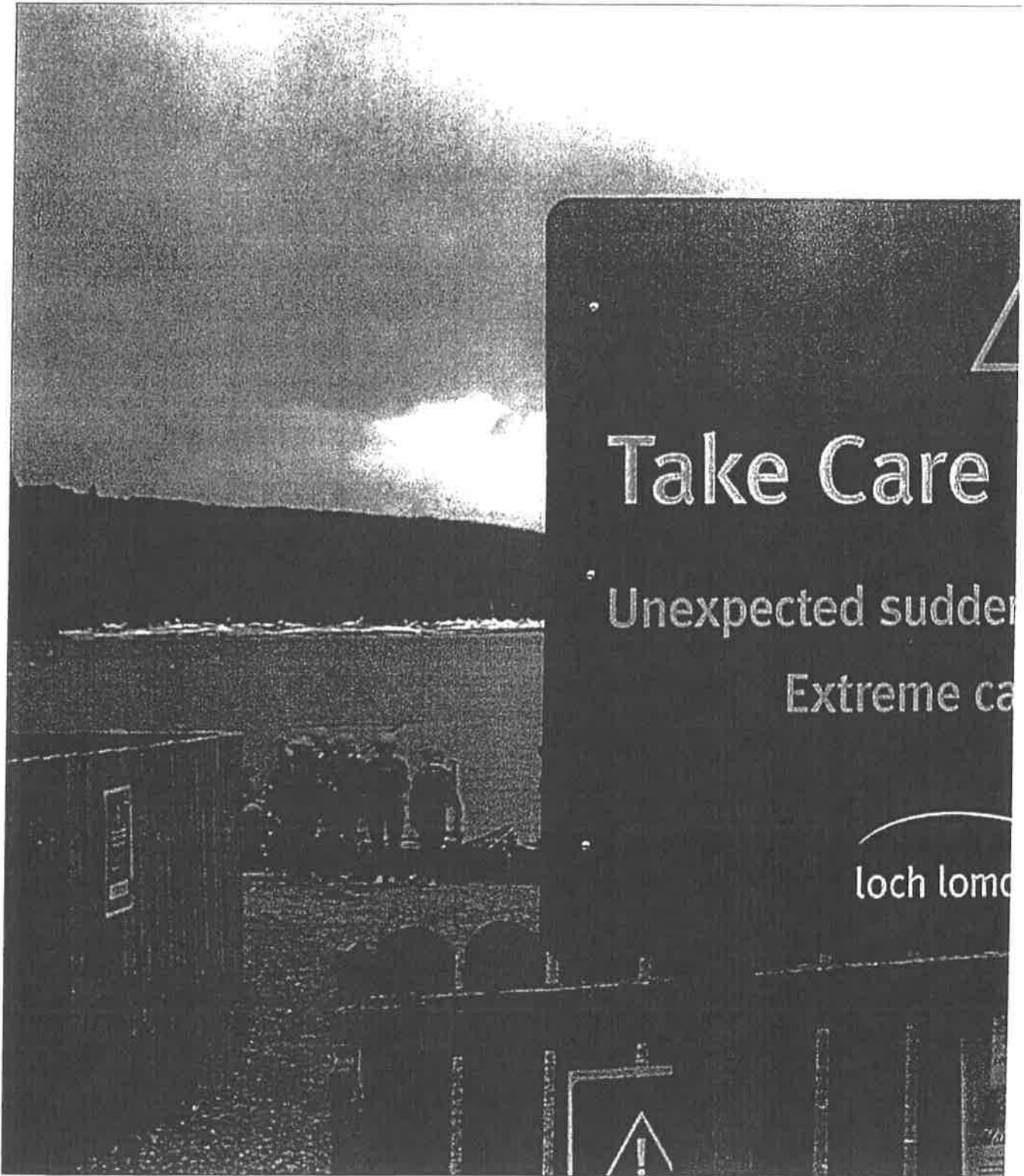

Thank you for your email. Yes, this is going to be resolved before the swimming competition. For the European Open Water Championships, Glasgow 2018 (Glasgow City Council) requested to widen parts of the navigation channel that facilitates boat access into Drumkinnon Bay. This was granted planning consent from the National Park and also consent from Scottish Enterprise, the landowner. SEPA also issued a CARS license to the contractor to allow the works to take place. Part of this work required a temporary slipway to be created for dredging equipment to access the water. Unfortunately, following removal of the temporary slipway, the water level in the loch dropped and revealed that the feature or 'hole' you see below had been created. This was not intentional and is not required for any part of the swimming competitions and we are working as quickly as possible with the contractor to resolve the issue. As you say, people enjoy paddling here, even though there has always been an uneven surface underfoot, which is flagged up in notices. However, when this current issue was brought to our attention we arranged additional signage to be put in place warning users of the abrupt uneven surface. The contractors intend to carry out remedial work within two weeks or so by redistributing the ground material to its former position, creating a more even profile. Thank you for getting in touch. I understand your concerns and hope to re-assure you that we are working closely with Glasgow 2018 and their contractors to prioritise this work in the bay.
