REQUEST UNDER FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

Thank you for your 23^{rd} request for information under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, received by email on 2^{nd} November 2015. Your specific requests and the relevant information held by the Park Authority are provided below.

Date the National Park sought external legal advice on the timescales for publishing BOTH committee papers and circulating draft Board Minutes to members of the Board.

External legal advisers were instructed on 23rd March 2015 to conduct a review of <u>all</u> our Standing Orders and Terms of Reference.

What did the National Park ask for advice on? (i.e. did the National Park ask any explicit questions of the legal firm involved, what was the brief?)

As stated above, the external legal advisers were asked to conduct a review of our Standing Orders and Terms of Reference.

What was the advice provided by the solicitors? (I appreciate there may be issues of providing the exact advice furnished by the legal firm but a summary of what that advice was should I think be made available to the public).

The advice provided by our external legal advisers is considered to be confidential communications under S36(1) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002. This is an absolute exemption, which means we do not need to consider the public interest in the disclosure of this information, it is completely exempt from release.

a copy of the relevant part of the draft minute. (this is in relation to the changes to the Standing Orders that were agreed at the Board meeting on 26th October 2015).

The draft minute will be available with the Agenda for the next Board meeting, scheduled to take place on 14th December 2015. This means that we are not obliged to release this information to you as it is scheduled for future publication under S27 (1)(a)(i) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.
