REQUEST UNDER ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2004

Further to your request for information, received by email on 1st March 2016 under the Environmental (Scotland) Regulations 2004, your specific requests and the response from the National Park Authority are provided below.

I would be grateful if you could clarify if Linda McKay was one of the people who made comments about the appearance and visual impact of the gates when consulted as a matter of courtesy and if so what these comments were?

Linda McKay did not make any comments about the appearance and visual impact of the gates at the Loch Venachar. Accordingly, I have to advise you under section 17(1)(b) of the Act, that the Park Authority holds no information on this subject.

I would be grateful if you could inform me whether there was any consultation about the re-design of the carparks and surrounding area along the Invertrossachs Road with the people of Callander to whom this land was originally gifted and then passed over to the Park to manage? If so, what form did this consultation take and what was the feedback?

Upgrade works including engineering operations to the shore, formation of additional parking, landscaping and the formation of footpaths and picnic areas, formed the basis of planning application ref 2014/0277/DET, which was made publically available via the Park Authority online planning portal. A submission in relation to this planning application was received by Callander Community Council, details of which were recorded on the delegated report. The Park Authority owns the land at this location.

request, you are entitled to ask the Authority to review its decision. Please note that in order for a review to take place you must:-

- Lodge a written request for a review within 40 working days of either the date on which vou received a response from the University or the date by which you should have received a response under the terms of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004, whichever is the later.
- Include your name, address for correspondence, a description of the original request, and the reasons why you are dissatisfied; and
