REQUEST UNDER ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2004

I refer to your request for information, received by email on 7th January 2017.

We have applied the exemption under Section 39(2) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 as we have determined that the information sought in your request is environmental information. We are therefore handling your request under the terms of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (EIRs). In this case the public interest in maintaining this exemption and in dealing with the request in line with the requirements of the EIRs outweighs any public interest in disclosing the information under FOISA.

Your specific requests and the response from the National Park Authority are provided below.

please provide me with all information the LLTNPA holds on how it developed its submission to the Land Reform Review Group and who was involved in this, including:

a) Were any Board Members involved in developing the content or approving the submission and were any meetings involving Board Members held to discuss this? If so, please provide all written information pertaining to those meetings and any communications from Board Members about the submission.

The Park Authority Convener attended a meeting with members of the Land Reform Review Group on Friday 15th February 2013. All information held in relation to this meeting is attached.

There is no information held regarding Board Member involvement in developing the content or approving the Park Authority's consultation response. There is no record of any meeting involving Board Members, or communications from Board Members to discuss the Park Authority submission to the Land Reform Review Group. Accordingly I have to advise under R10(4)(a) of the EIRs that this information is not held.

b) Who was present (staff and Board Members) at the presentation to the Land Reform **Review Group?**

Welcome brief (Linda)

- 1. Welcome the opportunity to discuss these issues with the Land Reform Review Group
- 2. Whilst some of the issues we will discuss are at their most severe in the National Park they are not unique to the Park
- 3. National Park very pro-access but feel that when there is significant visitor pressure there is a need for management
- 4. Looking for ways to balance the visitor experience, resident issues and conservation interests
- 5. Land Reform is a good piece of legislation for 95% of scenarios. With some tweaks (wild camping etc) it could be an excellent piece of legislation
- 6. National Parks provide an opportunity to test new approaches before rolling out across Scotland
- 7. The NPA has the evidence base and practical experience that should be useful for reviewing the issues.

On the wider issue of land ownership etc I think we should be wary about getting drawn in to a great deal of detail. The only point I might make is around scale, capital and conservation interests.
