

## First up – avoid having a fire if you can help it (and never in periods of hot, dry weather)



## For cooking use a camping stove, it's quicker, cleaner, safer



## Use a portable raised firepit

This helps preserve the ground underneath, preventing damage to the environment and limiting fire risks



## If you must have a fire keep it...

- Small
- Under control
- Supervised at all times



Ensure the fire is extinguished before leaving or going to sleep





Camping Management Byelaws are in place between 1st March and 30th September to help reduce environmental damage. Within Camping Management Zones it is an offence to have a fire which causes or is likely to cause damage. This may include the burning of the ground/vegetation/grass. It is also an offence to collect or use wood from a Camping Management Zone, such as cutting trees or even burning deadwood.
