

## **Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park Authority Proposed Loch Lomond Byelaws 2023**

Notice is hereby given that Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park Authority intend to apply to Scottish Government Ministers for confirmation of revised byelaws relating to Loch Lomond.

The Loch Lomond Byelaws cover the waters of Loch Lomond and its tributaries, distributaries and navigable rivers, as well as the shoreline, banks and islands of Loch Lomond. These byelaws assist in the management of activity on Loch Lomond, seeking to ensure that the Loch can be enjoyed safely and responsibly.
