REQUEST UNDER FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

We write further to our letter of 03 July 2024 in which we responded to parts 2, 3, 5, 7 and 8 of your request for access to information held by the Park Authority. Please find below our updated response, which now includes our answers to parts 1, 4 and 6 of your request.

Your Request

Can I please request, in the form of a spreadsheet such as Excel or CSV file, information on all fines/action taken in relation to breaches of the Camping Management Zones/camping byelaws at Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park. For the period - since the byelaw began to the present day - I would like monthly and annual figures showing the information below. I would also like the information broken down by tents and motorhomes/campervans and by location within the national park.
