REQUEST UNDER FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

We refer to your request for information, received by email on 19 June 2025. The information you have requested is environmental information, as defined in Regulation 2 of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (EIRs). We have therefore applied the exemption in section 39(2) of FOISA and dealt with your request under the EIRs alone.

Your specific requests and the Park Authority's response are provided below.

Your Request

Following the article in the Daily Record about Derek Mackay advising Flamingo Land please provide me with:

- a) Any information the LLTNPA holds about contact with Derek Mackay from when he was Minister for Local Government and Planning (from 7th Dec 2011 to November 2014) emails, notes of any meeting etc
- b) Any information the LLTNPA holds about contact with Derek Mackay since his resignation from the Scottish Government on 6th February 2020

 emails, notes of any meetings etc. or references to him by Flamingo I and and the second state of the second se
- emails, notes of any meetings etc or references to him by Flamingo Land and their agents.

Our Response

- a) The only information we hold involving contact with Derek Mackay is a briefing document for a ministerial visit which took place on 11 June 2013. We have included the briefing document document and the related appendices in our response below.
- b) Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park Authority does not hold any information of contact with Derek Mackay since his resignation as a Scottish Government Minister. Therefore, under exemption 12(4)(a) we must advise that this information is not held.

☑ From Glasgow, Edinburgh and the south take the M8 to Junction 30 then M898, continue on A898 sign-posted Erskine Bridge. Branch left merging into the A82 sign-posted Crianlarich. Leave the A82 turning right at the Stoneymollan roundabout, straight on at next roundabout then left at the next roundabout; building and car park are immediately on the right. Travel time from central Glasgow approximately 40 minutes.
 ☑ From the North (West side Loch Lomond) take the A82 turn left at the Stoneymollan roundabout then as above.

☑ From the East (East side Loch Lomond), at Stirling take A811 to Balloch. Stay on A811 (do not take turn into village) at first roundabout in Balloch turn right and building and car park are immediately on the right. Time from Stirling 50 minutes.

BIOGRAPHIES

Linda McKay, Convener, Loch Lomond & the Trossachs National Park Authority

Linda is Principal of Forth Valley College, which was formed after the merger of Clackmannan College and Falkirk College in 2005. She began her academic career in 1976 teaching Languages at Moray College and went on to become Assistant Principal at Dundee College, Depute Principal at Glenrothes College and then in 1999 took up post of Principal at Falkirk College.

Linda was a member of the SFC/SDS Skills Committee until very recently and is a founder member of the Goodison Group in Scotland. Linda was appointed to the Board of Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park Authority in October 2010 and was elected Convener in February 2011.

Linda has recently accepted an invitation to be a member of the Commission for Developing Scotland's Young Workforce which will engage senior figures in the world of business and education in re-examining the purpose of vocational education in future.

Linda was awarded an MBE in 2000 for services to the Police. In her spare time, her hobbies include travel, hill walking and photography.

Gordon Watson, Director of Operations, Loch Lomond & the Trossachs National Park Authority

Gordon is Director of Operations overseeing all aspects of Rural Development, Planning, Conservation and Visitor Experience for the National Park Authority. Between 1999 and 2002, Gordon worked on the establishment of Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park, including as a new planning authority. Notable achievements have included the Carrick Resort development which has been recognised by Scottish and UK RTPI Planning Awards. More recently, has seen the securing of a £70m inward investment, Ben Arthur Resort development at the former MOD Torpedo Range in Arrochar The proposed comprehensive development comprises; A 130 bed 5 star hotel / 250 Berth Marina/chandlery/cafe facilities / 16 luxury residential properties / 36 fractional apartments. Gordon is also working closely with Scottish Canals, other National Agencies and Scottish Ministers on a National Scottish Scenic Routes Initiative to promote and develop Scotland's scenic drives and viewpoints. He is also responsible for the National Park's sustainable tourism and community development functions which incorporate the Park's RTPI-Commended Community Futures initiative.

Gordon has led significant initiatives to engage private businesses in improving the tourism product in the Park co-ordinating private and public investment. He has worked with the larger tourism businesses in the Park to establish a Destination Group to drive tourism activity and investment. He also plays a key role in working jointly with Transport Scotland on the sensitive upgrade of the A82 and other trunk roads in the Park. Initiatives have included establishing a scheduled Waterbus network on Loch Lomond (now extended to Loch Katrine) and investing in new public infrastructure on busy lochside sites, long distance routes and in towns and villages. Gordon oversees a £1m plus annual capital programme and he also oversees the Park's work encouraging sensitive hydro energy projects.

will be accompanied by is Director of Antonine Developments who are the applicants for the Ben Arthur Resort. Antonine Developments have commissioned Archial to design the Ben Arthur Resort and achieve planning permission for the development. They have also secured prestigious operators for the 5 star Hotel and holiday apartments as well as a world class Marina.

FES is currently involved in major investment in recreation and tourism infrastructure to boost tourism at Galloway Forest Park (Kirroughtree/Glentrool/ Clatteringshaws centres), Queen Elizabeth Forest Park (The Lodge at Aberfoyle), Tay Forest Park (Queensview). This follows the major redevelopment in Tweed Valley Forest Park at Glentress Peel. Some of these current developments are supported by Scottish Government 'shovel ready' investment as are major works on the West Highland Way and Great Glen Way.

FCS is also a shareholder in the Forest Holidays Joint Venture which operates high quality forest cabins exclusively on the forest estate across Britain. This includes two sites in Scotland at Arrochar and Strathyre, both located in the Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park. Forest Holidays have worked closely with the Park and FCS to deliver new development at Arrochar involving the construction of a total of 40 cabins on a former campsite representing a capital investment of £5 million. Further developments are being considered at Strathyre and Glenmore. Forest Holiday developments are regarded as prime examples of sustainable tourism developments within forests which meet the aims of both the Park and FCS in terms of the nature and quality of the build and are also highly successful in business terms (90% occupancy) whilst boosting the local visitor economy.

FES are currently exploring in conjunction with local authorities further development opportunities on Scotland's national forest estate through the preparation of masterplans covering sites at Leanachan Forest (Nevis Range), Glentress Peel and Glenmore. Further potential may exist where there are gaps in tourism infrastructure in other localities such as Aberfoyle, Dumfries and Galloway, Moray coast, Inverness and Skye.

The contribution which Scotlands' forests already make together with development opportunities as described above is recognised in the draft NFP3 and also in the related tourism development plan being assembled by VisitScotland.



BEN ARTHUR RESORT, ARROCHAR – SUMMARY

- 1. The site comprises a former MOD torpedo range site which has being lying derelict for many decades at the head of Loch Long.
- 2. The Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park Local Plan, adopted in late 2011, presents a planning vision for tourism to transform Arrochar and Tarbet into a more significant tourism destination linked to water based tourism.
- 3. The former MOD Torpedo Range is identified as a strategic tourism inward investment opportunity.
- 4. The planning application which fully responded to this vision came forward during 2012.
- 5. The proposed comprehensive development comprises;
 - ➤ A 130 bed 5 star hotel
 - 250 Berth Marina/chandlery/cafe facilities
 - 16 luxury residential properties,
 - 36 fractional apartments,
- 6. The project represents an initial £70m inward investment. The projected economic benefits of the project are;
 - > 300 jobs (260 on-site and 40 off-site) full-time equivalent staff.
 - generates economic wealth in the local economy of £9.8m every year
 - generates disposable income (wages) of £5.6m every year
 - bring in c.100,000 visitors to the Park which generates additional expenditure of £2.9m in the economy every year
 - **210** one-off construction jobs
 - From construction period generate new economic wealth of £13.2m
 - From construction period generate disposable income (wages) of £6.9m
- 7. The planning application will be determined by the NPA Planning and Access Committee on 28th January, 2013, less than 4 months since the EIA was submitted.
- 8. The development is fully funded subject to planning and that works are proposed to begin on site within weeks of the consent being released.
- 9. The resort will be developed in a single phase and hopes to welcome its first customers in early 2015.
- 10. This represents a high level of confidence to commit to such a significant investment demonstrating how the quality of Scotland's environment can be a generator for growth.

ARDGARTEN FOREST HOLIDAYS SITE, nr ARROCHAR

- Located on the western shore of Loch Long, approx. 4.5 kilometres to the west of Arrochar, the site
 is situated on a low lying delta feature of the adjacent River Croe. The site is accessed from the A83
 Trunk Road.
- 2. At the time of the initial planning application the site operated as a Forestry Commission touring caravan/camping site and contained no chalets.
- 3. Subsequently leased to "Forest Holidays" tourism operators who submitted the following planning applications for re-development of the tourism site.
 - Permission approved in 2008 (subject to Section 75 legal agreement) for the erection of 28no. timber holiday chalets on part of the site
 - Section 75 clauses required that the site be retained in single ownership; and restricted periods of occupation to holiday occupancy only.
 - Design and layout negotiations between applicants and planning authorities led to a much improved scheme.
 - Chalet design 1 bed, 2 bed and 3 bed chalets suspended on short piles; grey tile clad asymmetric pitched roofs with deep overhanging eaves; timber clad walls (dark oak colour) – simple, light-touch structures.
- 4. Following approval and implementation of permission, site operated with dual use of chalets and touring caravans/camping pitches.
 - Permission approved in 2012 to remove all remaining touring caravan/camping pitches and develop the remainder of the site with 13no. additional timber cabins of the same design bringing the total to 41no. chalets
 - Layout negotiations between applicants and planning authority led to a much improved scheme with reduction in potential tree impacts and avoidance of potential flood risk issues
 - Updated occupation restriction to cover the whole site in line with current policy approach
 - Permission approved to amend the existing Section 75 agreement to ensure that only single entity management of the site was addressed in the legal agreement and all other elements discharged
 - Landscaping scheme for the whole site currently being reviewed and once agreed will be implemented to further assimilate the chalets with their surroundings. "Dark Sky" friendly external lighting approved.

- 5. Chalet site due to re-open this year.







CGI 05 - 5 Years




CGI 05 - 20 Years



MATERIALS / FINISHES

Sandtoft clay interlocking roof tiles on 18.5° pitch roof. 'Cassius' antique slate effect.

2. EXTERNAL WALL

External tongue and grooved timber cladding (Organically treated 75x18 mm) to be sta with Sadolin Ultra, colour: Dark Oak or other similar approved. Cladding laid vertically chorizontally above and below window and door locations.

3. 500mm deep treated TIMBER EAVES without gutters.
